- FOWS volunteers organized a Washington Cross Country team for the first time in many years. Six students participated in meets at schools throughout Nevada County

- FOWS worked with the School District and Nevada County Arts Council to bring an international poetry program to Washington School
- FOWS purchased books for the school library and replacements for aging school supplies
- December 2017, FOWS received its official non-profit charter with the State of California!
